

Reading Skills Quick Assessment

Reading difficulties underlie most academic struggles. Use the following checklist to see if your child shows signs of a reading disorder. When you are done, total up your answers for each column to determine the next steps.

Does your child make mistakes when reading new words?				
Does your child resist reading for long periods of time?				
Does your child have difficulty rereading his/her own writing?				
Does your child get self-conscious about reading out load?				
Does your child get tired quickly from reading and writing tasks?

Was your child slow to develop oral language skills, or have trouble rhyming words?				
Does your child omit or misread common small words when reading (i.e. <i>the</i> , <i>was</i> , <i>on</i> , <i>at</i>)?				
Does your child spell words correctly on spelling tests, but repeatedly misspell them on writing assignments?				
Does your child show stronger comprehension when listening to a story or directions than when reading them?				
Does your child guess at or mumble through longer, multisyllabic words in print?				
Does your child have difficulty with words problems in math despite having strong math fact and calculation skills?
